PHILADELPHIA EAGLES TO PAY TRIBUTE TO 9/11 ANNIVERSARY WITH LARGE-SCALE MEAL PACK EVENT AT LINCOLN FINANCIAL FIELD

On September 11, in recognition of the 9/11 anniversary and Hunger Action Month, volunteers from Philadelphia will join together to pack more than 825,000 meals at Lincoln Financial Field for Philabundance. This is the fourth consecutive year in which the Eagles are hosting a large-scale meal pack event for the nonprofit 9/11 Day, becoming a National Day of Service for the organization.

[According to Feeding America](#), more than 47 million Americans face food insecurity in the United States, including 14 million children.

The team's annual meal pack event is one of 24 large-scale volunteer service projects being organized nationally by the nonprofit 9/11 Day, which began in 2002. Across the U.S., more than 30,000 individuals are expected to volunteer at 9/11 Day's signature meal pack events, assembling more than nine million shelf-stable meals for food insecure Americans.

PHILADELPHIA EAGLES TO HOST MOBILE JUNIOR PRO CLINIC AT RUDOLPH BLANKENBURG SCHOOL

The event, in partnership with ACME, supports the team's commitment to growing the game at the youth level

To inspire the next generation of athletes, the Philadelphia Eagles will host a Mobile Junior Pro introductory football clinic at the Rudolph Blankenburg School on Monday, September 15. Students will participate in a brief warmup led by the Eagles rookie class, followed by a five-station drill rotation introducing the primary skills used to play football. The clinic will close with a Q&A session involving an Eagles Legend.

Mobile Junior Pro is a non-contact, introductory football clinic for elementary and middle school-aged children designed to teach the game, increase participation rates, and foster a passion for football in the local community.

EAGLES TO HOST PUPPY & YOGA CLASS IN HONOR OF CRUCIAL CATCH

The event, in partnership with Bringing Hope Home, promotes early detection of screenable cancers

In recognition of [Crucial Catch](#), the National Football League's initiative to raise awareness and fight screenable cancers through early detection and risk reduction, the Philadelphia Eagles will host 50 [Bringing Hope Home](#) guests impacted by cancer for a puppy yoga class at the NovaCare Complex on Tuesday, September 30. Beneficial for participants and puppies, the relaxing event will promote wellness, community, and connection. Additionally, the Eagles will donate \$5,000 to Bringing Hope Home to support their mission of providing "Unexpected Amazingness®" to local families with cancer through financial and emotional support.

Crucial Catch sets out to detect cancer early before it has the chance to grow and spread. The five-year survival rate for many cancers is over 90% when detected early, so getting screened is crucial to catching cancer when it may be easier to treat.

EAGLES, BRADYPLUS, & SIMON'S HEART TO HOST CPR TRAINING EVENT

The Eagles, BradyPLUS, and Simon's Heart will team up to promote heart health and safety

According to [research](#), heart disease affects thousands of Americans every year. Creating a Cardiac Emergency Response Plan (CERP), along with learning about heart disease, detecting symptoms, and handling situations can help prevent fatal outcomes of cardiac arrest.

To provide education on the importance of heart health, the Eagles are partnering with BradyPLUS and Simon's Heart to host a CPR training at the NovaCare Complex on Tuesday, October 21 from 6-8 p.m. As part of the event, the Eagles will donate \$15,000 to Simon's Heart for AED and CPR training, and to also support the continuation of AED donations throughout Philadelphia. The Collingdale United and Upland Hurricanes football teams, BradyPLUS volunteers, and Simon's Heart representatives will practice AED and CPR training and also participate in a non-contact football practice.

Simon's Heart works to prevent sudden cardiac arrest and death in children, teens, and young adults through heart screenings, education, advocacy, and innovation.
